I still love to teach whenever I can and this Monday I had the pleasure of teaching Reception Rashford class: they are a talented bunch!

We were learning about parts of the body and one girl expertly explained how the role of the heart was to pump blood containing oxygen around the body-not the answer I was expecting from a 4 year old! Children never cease to amaze, they are sponges and are able to absorb information in incredible ways. I had a lovely time and am looking forward to teaching Reception Thunberg class in a week or so.

This week and last, Ms Kirby and I have been watching lots of teaching and learning across the school. This process includes talking to the children about their learning and finding out what our children enjoy most about school and what helps them learn best.

Our children are fortunate to be taught by some of the very best teachers and learning support assistants around and I am forever impressed at the sophistication of the teaching strategies which they use. We are a research driven school and one area of focus at the moment is the expectation of children using full sentence answers. Teachers use 'stem sentences' to help children frame their responses.

Earlier this week, we were visited from colleagues at St Marks Primary and we moderated writing together. Yesterday, we hosted some training on maths mastery and were visited by other teachers from schools across Brighton. We are always keen to work with schools across the city and share best practice. We are always seeking ways of refining our teaching methods, the best schools never stand still.

There is a rather historical feel to the school today with the Year 4 children enjoying a Roman day with lots of workshops and Victorian day in Year 6 where some rather old fashioned teaching techniques are the order of the day-teaching has come a long way since 1901!




"Students who read for pleasure make significantly more progress in vocabulary, spelling and maths than children who read very little." Sullivan and Brown 2013.

With the encouragement of an enchanting and magical teacher, she writes a poem. But a poem is meant to be read aloud. She musters all her courage, stands at the front of the class and shows her classmates that she does have a voice. And her voice is beautiful. The perfect way to encourage empathy in young children and show shy children how to feel brave.


