

# The Bedtime Book of Even More Impossible Questions by Isabel Thomas and illustrated by Margarida Esteves



A fabulous dive into the endless wonders of the world that will make bedtime absolutely awesome! Packed with quirky, thought-provoking, and sometimes utterly baffling questions that make bedtime exciting and fun! From asking, 'When did time start?' to, 'Why can't we feel earth moving through space?' the book covers so many topics-science, philosophy, nature, animals, culture, and beyond. We loved leaning that:

- 4 Hippos kill 500 people a year protecting their territory!
- The Sun's atmosphere gets up to 300 times hotter than its surface.
- The best theory is that the universe began at least 13.8 billion years ago!


The short, snappy answers are perfect for anyone who are eager to learn!

The illustrations are brilliant. Each page bursts with vibrant colours and detailed drawings that are playful and engaging.

We loved reading this and laughing and pondering on things we discovered. We also loved that they supported the learning, making unfamiliar concepts more relatable.

The perfect gift for all children! Following on from The Bedtime Book of Impossible Questions, this books provides EVEN MORE answers to the weird, wonderful and sometimes downright dumbfounding questions that buzz around kids' brains at bedtime - covering topics such as philosophy, science, nature, animals, geography, culture and more. With fascinating but short, succinct answers and inviting illustrations, it really is the ideal read for curious kids.

### The Night We Got Stuck in a Story by Ben Miller



The story tells of siblings, Lana and Harrison (from The Day I Fell into a Fairytale), who go to visit their grandparents and are upset to find that their favourite play spot (an old, hollow tree) is under threat. When Lana speaks to developers and makes a deal she soon regrets, she cannot put it out of her mind. That night, a mysterious golden thread leads her back to the old, hollow tree and Lana and Harrison end up getting pulled (quite literally) into storybook land full of mystery and adventure. Lana finds herself with a very big problem – she needs to rescue her brother before it is too late, but he isn't the only one who needs her help!

At the end of the book, author Ben Miller spends time sharing some of the ideas behind his writing in 'A Brief Note About Spiders'. When I read this aloud, this part sparked the interest of children in the class and they were fascinated to learn about the real-life animals that inspired the Golden Diving Bell Spiders.


