Times Tables Rockstars

TIMES TABLES ROCKSTARS 'BATTLE OF THE BANDS #2' STARTS TODAY!

The first KS2 'Battle of The Bands' competition was a huge success, with over 60 children taking part. We want even more children to have a go this time round, as the Battle #2 begins after school today!

Classes will compete against each other from 3.30pm today until 4.30pm on Thursday (we're giving children an extra chance to add to their score after school on the final day), completing as many times tables questions as they can, as fast as they can, and adding to their class's points total. Here's everything you need to know:

• Children should go to https://play.ttrockstars.com/auth/school/student and login using the following format:

Example - Billy Smith

Username: smibill Password: (usual school password)

If you have any problems logging in, please let your child's teacher know.

- Battles will start on Fridays at 3.30pm and finish the following Thursday at 4.30pm.
- Certificates will be given to the winning class and the 3 highest scoring children from across KS2 performances will also be celebrated on the display opposite the KS2 Hall and added to the school newsletter.
- Only the FIRST 30 MINUTES of play per day will count towards the children's battle totals (but they can of course practise more if they choose).
- Children can use whichever level they want when playing Jamming, Gig, Garage etc. The TTRS algorithm will automatically filter the times tables your child needs to work on.

PLEASE NOTE, you do not have to click on the 'Tournament' icon first - the children in KS2 are automatically entered into the tournament, so just start playing! The live league table will be hidden from children until the end of the tournament, but teachers will update their classes throughout the week on how they're doing.

Here are the dates of the battles this term:

- Battle 3 Friday 14th February to Thursday 20th February (over half term)
- Battle 4 Friday 28th February to Thursday 6th March
- Battle 5 Friday 14th March to Thursday 20th March
- Battle 6 Friday 28th March to Thursday 3rd April






Can a birdwatcher outwit an escaped convict?

Please can all parents make sure grapes are cut before sending in to school as a snack or in a packed lunch box. Grapes should be cut in half length ways to avoid any choking.








Named clothing
